

## STUDIO LESSON COVID-SAFE MEASURES

### **Background**

I have adult students who work in a variety of workplaces, and school age students who attend a variety of different schools.

Online video lessons remain an option for those that wish.

Continuation of studio lessons is dependent on it remaining safe. That is, I need to be comfortable that we are doing everything we can to protect us, and that government guidelines and regulations are being followed.

### **COVID- safe measures**

- The 4 square metre rule means only one person other than myself can be inside at any one time. Instrument set-up will be outside on the front porch. There is a table for instrument set-up, and seating for anyone wishing to wait while the lesson is happening. I have set up an outdoor heater for when it is needed.
- Social distancing must be maintained at all times.
- Hand sanitising station for use by students before each lesson
- Daily cleaning and sanitising of the studio.
- If you are sick the studio lesson will not be able to take place. If you are well enough to play at home, an online video lesson will replace the studio lesson. If you are too sick to play, I will use the lesson time to record a video lesson to work through when you are able to.
- If I am sick I will provide an online video lesson instead, or a make-up credit if I am not well enough.
- Any quarantine restrictions required because of the results of tests (mine or my students') or government guidelines will need to be observed.
